WILL EXPLAIN INVENTION.

**Originator of Telharmonic System
to Talk to Scientists.**

At Columbia University this afternoon there will be opened the annual joint convention of the National Association of Music Teachers and the National Educational Musical Alliance, the latter body representing the music educational interests of a dozen or more universities, a branch of the Teachers' College Department.

Among the most important subjects for discussion at these annual conventions of the bodies named is that of "New Invention." - For months past the committee of arrangements have, with other leaders of musical thought throughout the world, considered that the Cahill Telharmonic System is the most scientific development of the day in musical art, and it has been arranged that Dr. Thaddeus Cahill, the inventor of the system, should lecture to the convention on the "New Invention" subject.
