BASEBALL AT NIGHT FOR THE BOSTON FANS

Boston, Mass., Sept. 5.—Three Holyoke men, George F. Cahill, and his brothers, Dr. Thaddens and Arthur, after years of endeavor to make baseball at night a possibility, believe that they have succeeded. Plants to illuminate the National League grounds in Pittsburg, Cincinnati, Philadelphia and Chicago have been installed, and very soon it is expected that baseball games will be witnessed at night. It takes 37,000,000 candle power to make baseball at night satisfactory. Half of the light is thrown into the diamond and half into the sky above the field. The lights are thrown from cylinders on poles more than 100 feet above the field.
